Wembury Heritage Database

This database lists buildings, other structures and localities considered to be of heritage significance in Wembury Parish. It is based on work undertaken in 2006-7 by Martin Dyer of Exeter Archaeology, assisted locally by Eileen Arnold (the Chair of Wembury Local history Society), assisted by two Society members - Sue Johnston and June Horne. The number of entries listed – more than 300 – underlines the richness of the parish's history.

The information is provided here in Word format, converted into an Adobe pdf file. This is therefore searchable for key words of your choosing, using the Adobe search facility.

Locating the entries geographically

Columns 4 and 5 of the table below give the grid reference of each entry, enabling the sites to be located on today's OS 1:25,000 or 1:50,000 maps of Wembury. Alternatively, a set of plans can be downloaded from Wembury Local History Society's website. On these plans:

• The geographical location of each item is shown on the maps as a RED NUMBER.

- Areas outlined in GREEN show the original boundaries of the fields described in the database as they are shown on the Tithe Map or, in a few cases, in the Calmady Atlas of 1788/89.
- BROWN features on the maps denote banks or ditches identified on the 1946 RAF air photographic survey.

It must be stressed that inclusion in the database does NOT indicate that any specific site is accessible to the public, although many are accessible from roads and public footpaths or bridleways.

Appendix 1

Background to project

Exeter Archaeology was commissioned by South Hams District Council to carry out a parish heritage appraisal in Wembury between April 2006 and March 2007. This was the third year of the Parish Heritage Appraisals project, which was one of a number of programmes included in the Life into Landscape: South Devon initiative. The Life into Landscape initiative was funded by The Heritage Lottery Fund, the European Regional Development Fund: Objective 2, English Heritage, the Countryside Agency, South Hams District Council and Devon County Council.

The primary aims of the scheme were:

• to enhance the existing archaeological information held by the Devon County HER for these parishes. It was also anticipated that the information generated by the survey would be a valuable resource that could be used for the interest and benefit of local residents, landowners and visitors. It would be used to inform current and future agrienvironment and conservation schemes, public access and interpretation initiatives as well as general archaeological and historic research.

to raise awareness of archaeology and heritage at a local level. Exeter Archaeology worked closely with Wembury Local History Societies when carrying out the appraisals. Members most closely involved were Eileen Arnold, Sue Johnston and June Horne.

Appendix 2

Data collection

Data were collected from a number of different sources. The information was entered into an Access database, in a format agreed in consultation with the Devon County Historic Environment Service (DCHES). The locations of all the "sites" identified were marked on current 1:10000 scale Ordnance Survey maps provided by South Hams District Council. Existing information held in the Devon County Historic Environment Record (HER) for each parish was provided by the DCHES, and formed the basis of the survey database.

Historic maps in the Devon Record Office (DRO), the Westcountry Studies Library, Exeter and the Plymouth & West Devon Record Office (PWDRO) were examined for new sites and features. Maps were photocopied or digitally photographed where possible or consulted in the record offices and library. Any features or buildings shown on these maps that were not present on later or modern maps were identified. Those not already in the HER were added to the database and located on the 1:10000 base map. Maps consulted included: estate and other maps in the Devon Record Office and Plymouth & West Devon Record Office, Donn's 1765 map of Devon, Greenwood's 1827 map of Devon, and the c. 1785 Board of Ordnance and 1803 Ordnance Survey Surveyors Drawings. The most important historic map sources were the Tithe Maps for the four parishes held at the DRO, and the First Edition Ordnance Survey 6-inch maps and First Edition Ordnance Survey 25-inch maps (published 1867-1890). The Devon County Historic Environment Service kindly provided digital copies of the First and Second Edition OS 25-inch maps.

A search was made of the Tithe Apportionments at the DRO, to identify any archaeologically significant field names and add them to the database.

Aerial photographs held at the Devon County HER, in particular the 1946-1948 Royal Air Force coverage, were examined for potential new archaeological sites.

Up to date Listed Building data was obtained from South Hams District Council and the English Heritage Listed Buildings Online website, and added to the database where necessary.

A rapid survey was made of the published archaeological and historical sources relating to the parishes held at the Westcountry Studies Library; and a search was made of county and local museum collections for any artefacts from the parishes not previously recorded in the HER. The RAM Museum, Exeter, Plymouth Museum, Totnes Museum, Dartmouth and Cookworthy Museums were among those consulted.

Local history society members were encouraged to gather information locally and identify potential new "sites".

The entries in the database were assigned individual site numbers (CV 001 onwards for Chivelstone, NN 001 for Newton & Noss, SP 001 for South Pool and WM 001 for Wembury), and these were marked onto 1:10000 master maps.
