

Wembury's Listed Buildings



St Werburgh's Church, Grade I

Protection for a significant number of buildings and other structures is provided under the standard Ancient Monument and Listing system administered by Historic England. In the parish there are currently two Ancient Monuments and 1 building listed at Grade I, plus 9 buildings or features at Grade II* and 27 at Grade II. **It must be stressed that inclusion in the list does NOT indicate that any specific site is accessible to the public.**

This is the definitive list as at March, 2016, and has been derived from the official Historic England records. Earlier documents listing protected buildings are in circulation, but are incomplete because they do not include:

1. structures listed by Historic England in 2014 and later.
2. the Staddon Heights Historic Military Landscape, Wembury's only Ancient Monument. Scheduled in 1969, until recently this was recorded in a separate list, and consequently was overlooked when earlier lists were compiled. Of international importance, this landscape is arguably the most significant protected area in Wembury.

It should also be noted that the heavy anti-aircraft battery adjacent to Prince's Farmhouse has been re-designated. Formerly a Listed structure, it is now on the Ancient Monuments register.

All Ancient Monuments and Listed buildings and other features are detailed in the table. So far as is possible, this has been organised geographically to draw out the manner in which these structures cluster in different parts of the parish.

Full details of all structures can be found via the Historic England website , including location maps at the end of each citation. Click on 'Search the Listing' and search for Wembury. Note that this key word brings up two buildings at Coombe Farm which are in Brixton Parish and consequently are not listed below.

In addition to the protected structures cited here, there is **a second overview of officially recognised buildings and other features considered to be of heritage significance.** Access to their details has recently been greatly improved via the Historic England's **Pastscape website (pastscape.org.uk)**. A search for Wembury on this site currently produces 62 results, including the Listed buildings, Ancient Monuments, several offshore wrecks, and a number of sites outside the parish.
